Program Leadership and Administration

Serve as director of both the BA and MA programs in International Relations and Political Science, with responsibility for curriculum oversight, faculty coordination and recruitment, student advising, organizing of field study programs (including multi-day visits to Geneva, Brussels, and Strasbourg), and overall program development.

Redesigned the MA program in 2025 with the goal of increasing our completion rate, boosting enrollment, and future-proofing the program with a greater orientation towards clear career tracks and marketable skills. Required core courses now include International Negotiation and Research Methods for International Relations. The addition of a practitioner-focused track has resulted in increased enrollment and helped generate new partnerships with regional NGOs. Enrollments for the redesigned 2026/27 MA program have spiked and we expect to have our biggest cohort since the MA program started in 2016.

Spearheaded and negotiated a new cooperation agreement between ACM and Sciences Po Aix that will enable cross-registration of students in relevant courses and

create a platform for future academic collaboration among faculty. Also initiated and organized ACM's first school-wide Model European Union simulation involving over 50 students from seven courses.

Course Design

Designed and developed the following courses from inception:

- *The International Law and Politics of Armed Conflict* (BA level, exploring modern conflict dynamics and their implications in international humanitarian law)
- *Global Justice* (BA level, combining philosophical and sociological accounts of current challenges with the international legal and institutional frameworks meant to address those challenges)
- *Business and Human Rights* (MBA program, exploring the ethical and legal implications of globalized supply chains, employment practices, and environmental impacts)
- *Diplomacy and Human Rights* (BA and MA levels, 16-day intensive traveling seminar that explores how diplomacy influences international human rights and justice processes, visiting embassies, courts, NGOs and activists in France, Spain, Morocco, and The Netherlands).

Teaching

Teach 3 courses per semester at BA and MA level, including:

- Comparative Politics (MA core program, fall semester)
- The International Law and Politics of Armed Conflict
- Diplomacy and Human Rights in the Mediterranean (traveling intersession seminar every January)
- International Relations
- Global Justice
- Introduction to the European Union (not currently teaching)
- Business and Human Rights (MBA program, not currently teaching)

All courses carry 45 contact hours per semester. Current enrollment across all courses: approximately 120 students per year. I teach 315 contact hours per academic year.
